RESOLUTION NO. 2022-INTERNET-02

RECOMMENDING THE RENEWAL OF CONTRACT WITH PHILIPPINE LONG DISTANCE TELEPHONE (PLDT) CO., INC. AS THE INTERNET SERVICE PROVIDER OF THE NATIONAL PROSECUTION SERVICES XI OFFICES

WHEREAS, pursuant to BAC Resolution No. 2021-INTERNET-01 dated 12 November 2021, the Regional Prosecution Office (RPO) XI Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) recommended for the approval of the Head of the Procuring Entity (HOPE) the award of the contract for subscription of internet services for the following offices of the National Prosecution Services (NPS) XI to the Internet Service Provider (ISP) with the Lowest Calculated and Responsive Bids (LCRB), **Philippine Long Distance Telephone (PLDT) Co., Inc.**, viz:

WHEREAS, the HOPE approved the BAC Resolution on 12 November 2021 and issued the Notice to Proceed on 15 November 2021;

WHEREAS, the contract of internet services with the existing ISP for the aforementioned offices will be expiring soon;

WHEREAS, there is a need to continue the subscription of the said services in order not to disrupt the delivery of public service as far as online communication technology is concerned;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Provisions of Republic Act (RA) No. 9184, its Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (RIRR), and Appendix 21 on the Guidelines on Procurement of Water, Electricity, Telecommunications and Internet Services Providers, the end-users conducted a Cost Benefit Analysis to assess the quality of service provided by the existing ISP. Items nos. 3.3.1, 3.3.1.1, 3.3.1.2, and 3.3.1.3 of the Guidelines provide:

3.3.1 Existing Internet Service Providers (ISPs)

ISPs provide the initial infrastructure requirements (e.g. cabling) necessary in the provision of internet access. Changing ISPs every year may therefore prove to be more costly to government as every new ISP would have to charge the procuring entity for this initial investment. Further, changing ISPs entails interruption of internet access and, thus, any public service dependent on such access, Thus:

3.3.1.1 Contractual agreements previously entered into with ISPs shall be respected;

3.3.1.2 At the end of each year, however, the procuring entity must assess the quality of service provided by its ISP. For instance, it must compare the cost charged by said ISP and the range of services it offers as against other service providers in the area. It may also consider new technologies that may prove costly or those that are more advantageous to the government in terms of use, capacity and services offered, e.g. bandwidth, speed, platform, additional services, such as, but not limited to cloud computing, cloud storage, etc.

In assessing the quality of service provided by its ISP, procuring entities are encouraged to consult the Department of Information and Communications Technology or National Telecommunications Commission or other relevant government agencies regarding any new policy or directive in the implementation or use of new technology

3.3.1.3 If the result of said assessment or cost-benefit analysis, **conducted by the end-user**, continue to favor the exiting ISP, then the **Head of the Procuring Entity** may simply renew its services. If it does not, then the procuring entity should bid said services in accordance with subsection 3.3.2 of these guidelines.
